

Quarterly Meeting

July 2, 2006

Chairman Nelson Torbeck called the meeting to order. Pastor Wohletz read a selection from Isaiah Chapter 55 and spoke regarding the reading before leading those present in prayer. The minutes were read and accepted as read.

A motion to accept Tyler Kruenegel as a voting member received a second and carried. There were no releases for the past quarter. The Church picnic made a profit of \$878.78 and \$6048 was received for the building fund during the last quarter.

The Elders reported meeting monthly and that things are "going well". The Board of Education had nothing to report. The Trustees questioned keeping the well open after city water arrives on the Church property. There was no objection to keeping the well and the matter was turned over to the Trustees.

The Sunday School had nothing to report while the Bible Class is continuing their study of the Old Testament and urge people to attend. They will be studying the Liturgy this fall.

The Sexton, Junior Youth, and Senior Youth had nothing to report at this time. The Financemen reported doing fine. The Men of the Congregation will provide the closing cook out for the Vacation Bible School and are working on ideas for a fundraiser.

Pastor Wohletz was congratulated for being elected Circuit Counselor. Treasurer Scott Torbeck reported on bids for insurance for the Church property. He explained the coverage and, after some discussion, Charles Kruenegel volunteered to look into other bids.

Pastor Wohletz explained the nominating and election process for selection of a delegate to the July 2007 LCMS convention in Houston. The Chairman turned the matter of selecting a delegate over to the Board of Elders.

There was a discussion regarding the placement of the water meter and fire hydrant. After the reading of the minutes, the meeting was adjourned with the Lord's Prayer.
