

July 2007 Voter's Meeting Minutes

Quarterly Meeting

July 1, 2007

Chairman Nelson Torbeck called the meeting to order. Pastor Wohletz read a selection from 1 Kings regarding Elijah and spoke about Elijah's relationship with God. He then led those present in prayer. The minutes were read and accepted as read. There were no new members accepted during the past quarter. A motion to release Richard and Jennifer Greathouse to join a Methodist Church received a second and passed.

The Treasurer's report was given and the Picnic made a profit of \$1323.96. The Elders reported meeting monthly and discussing the affairs of the Church. The Board of Education had nothing to report at this time. The Trustees reported that there is water in the lines but that it has not yet received EPA approval, so the Church property will not be hooked up until the water receives EPA approval. An anonymous family of the Congregation wishes to buy exterior doors for the Church with the Congregation to pay for the installation. A motion to grant permission to proceed with the Door Project, with the Trustees to present ideas to the Congregation regarding the doors, received a second and carried.

The Sunday School encourages families to bring their children to Sunday School. The Bible Class sent a CARE package to service personnel and will do so again in two or three months if anyone cares to donate. The Financemen had nothing to report at this time. The Sexton had a question regarding tombstones and the Secretary is to check the minutes for past policies. The Young People will be taking a trip to Orlando at the end of July.

Under Old Business the Treasurer reported that the Congregation could purchase an Automated External Defibrillator (A.E.D) for approximately \$1118 with a grant. A motion to purchase an A.E.D.

received a second. There was a call for a secret ballot. The Chairman appointed Ron Harmeier, Tyler Kruenegel, and Dennis Schukar as tellers. After some discussion, the motion carried.

The Treasurer explained that the Congregation could purchase a wireless system to aid the Hearing Challenged for \$1,000. After some discussion, a motion to purchase a wireless system to aid the Hearing Challenged was made and received a second. After a call for a secret ballot, the motion passed. The Congregation will try to obtain matching funds from Thrivent.

The Chairman thanked and released the tellers. After the reading of the minutes, the meeting was adjourned with the Lord's Prayer.
