Dearly Beloved,

In the old days, when school would start after Labor Day, September would be the month when we would hear about Christian education. Now, school starts in August, so it's good to consider Christian education this month – and not just in school, but especially in the Christian home. And if you no longer have children at home, this still applies to you since we are all catechumens (disciples/learners) for life and not just for a few years of confirmation instruction. Such learning and study doesn't take the summer off, but continues year-round.

God says:

Train up a child in the way he should go; even when he is old he will not depart from it. (Proverbs 22:6 ESV) and

Fathers, do not provoke your children to anger, but bring them up in the discipline and instruction of the Lord. (Ephesians 6:4 ESV)

So how are parents, and especially fathers, to do that? How do parents bring up their children in the discipline and instruction (nurture and admonition) of the Lord? First of all, by setting the proper example for their children. This certainly includes regular, weekly participation in the Divine Service to receive God's gifts of forgiveness, life and salvation. After all, children learn more from the parent's example than from their words. As with anything else, if the parents make attentive church attendance a top priority, the children will learn that it is valuable and important. But if parents make worship an occasional occurrence, the children will learn that church is less important than other things. May it never be!

The second thing parents can do to raise disciples of Jesus is to talk about the things of God in the home. Discuss the sermon with them and teach them Bible verses, Bible stories, hymns, and the Catechism. And this teaching can't start early enough. The sooner children start hearing the Bible, hymns, and the Catechism, the easier they will learn them by heart. In fact, Dr. Martin Luther wrote the Small Catechism to help parents teach the faith to their children. Before each part of the Christian faith (Ten Commandments, Apostles' Creed, Lord's Prayer, Baptism, Confession and Office of the Keys, and the Sacrament of the Altar), he directs, "As the head of the family should teach it in a simple way to his household." Likewise, he includes these two directives in the section concerning Daily Prayers, "How the head of the family should teach his household to pray morning and evening;" and "How the head of the family should teach his household to ask a blessing and return thanks." He knew how important it is that parents teach their children the Christian faith, and the practices that flow from it. He knew how important it is for parents to give their children a "pattern of sound words" as St. Paul writes, "Hold fast the pattern of sound words which you have heard from me, in faith and love which are in Christ Jesus." (2 Tim. 1:13).

So how do parents teach their children Bible verses, Bible stories, hymns and the Catechism? I'm glad you asked. Family devotions are certainly a good place to start. Read a Bible story and talk about it. Choose a Bible verse or portion of the catechism and review it at meals or at bedtime. Read it through out loud once or twice, asking the child to repeat it after you. It doesn't have to be long and tedious. But especially with younger children, repetition is key. After hearing the same words each day for a week, your child will know it well, and so will you. Look for something coming soon to help you in this regard.

Why is it so important to learn the Bible verses and the Catechism by heart? "So that it can shape the faith and understanding of the catechumen [disciple/learner] and be used by him throughout his life as he learns to interpret Scripture, listen to preaching, receive absolution, pray, confess, and live in his vocation." (Bender, "Lutheran Catechesis", xi). Such learning is vital for our children and for us adults too, because knowing Bible verses, the Catechism, and hymns by heart will provide much strength and comfort throughout our life, especially as we face trials of various kinds, including at life's end.

And if parents need more help in teaching their children, they should read and study Luther's Small Catechism for themselves, as well as his Large Catechism. You would be amazed how modern and up-to-date Luther is. If you want or need a copy, please let me know. Also, if you ever have questions, please ask me. I'm glad to help as I can.

As we enter the month of August, our Sunday School and Bible Class resume. Make your attendance and participation a priority for you and your child(ren). Be here every week. You'll have something to talk about on the way home and throughout the week. Besides, then you won't be late for church.

God bless us all as we sit together at Jesus' feet in the Christian congregation and in the Christian home, and grant that we all learn to believe that we are sinners, learn repentance, learn to confess our sins, learn to trust in Christ for the forgiveness of sins, learn to call upon Him in prayer, learn to confess our faith before the world, learn to confess our sins to one another, learn to forgive one another as Christ has forgiven us, and learn to live faithfully in our vocation as hearers of the Word, husbands, wives, fathers, mothers, citizens of the land, and workers of every kind. (Bender, ix).
