The disciples of John and of the Pharisees were fasting. Then they came and said to Him, "Why do the disciples of John and of the Pharisees fast, but Your disciples do not fast?" And Jesus said to them, "Can the friends of the bridegroom fast while the bridegroom is with them? As long as they have the bridegroom with them they cannot fast. But the days will come when the bridegroom will be taken away from them, and then they will fast in those days." — Mark 2:18-20

Repentance, Prayer, and...Fasting?

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

February is a hard month. More cold. Snow and/or ice. Still wearing face masks and staying away from people. It's a good thing it's the shortest month. For many, Valentine's Day is the highlight of the month, though it can be a painful reminder for some of love gone awry, or loved ones lost. Yes, February can be a bleak time.

Then, coming off the grand celebrations of Christmas and Epiphany, which concludes with the Transfiguration of Our Lord (Feb. 14th), the Christian church take a bit of a turn. For Lent begins on Ash Wednesday (Feb. 17th). Turning toward the cross, Lent marks the beginning of the second portion of the church year, the time of Easter. Lent, like Advent, is a penitential season which prepares us to celebrate rightly what follows. The focus goes from the work of the Father in sending, incarnating, and revealing His Son in the time of Christmas to the suffering, death, and resurrection of Jesus in this portion of the church year.

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, and continues for 40 days (not counting the Sundays). The 40 days are a reminder of the 40 years that the Israelites wandered in the wilderness (reminding us of our sinfulness) and of the 40 days that Jesus Himself fasted and was tempted in the wilderness by Satan (reminding us of what our Lord has accomplished for our redemption).

We relive this experience, in a way, through the things that we do together as a church during Lent. Our congregation will meet on Wednesday evenings for additional services which are another opportunity to grow in our understanding of the great things our Lord has done for us in His Son.

We also relive these experiences of our Lord and our ancestors in the faith through some of the things we do as a congregation and as individual Christians during Lent. You might notice

during Lent that the word "Alleluia" will disappear from the liturgy in our services until Easter. It is not that in our Lenten worship we no longer "praise the Lord," rather we are muted or restrained in our worship in anticipation of the joy of Christ's resurrection from the dead at Easter!

Some Christians have also found great benefit in muting certain things in their own lives as part of their Lenten preparations for Easter. You may have done this yourself, or perhaps you know another Christian who has given something up for Lent. This practice is called fasting. Fasting during Lent is a self-imposed act of sacrifice. Its purpose is not to improve one's standing with God, rather it is a means of reducing something in our lives so that we may spend more time in prayer and learn to rely upon God rather than ourselves for all good things. Fasting is completely voluntary, and most often it involves eating much less than normal, or avoiding a certain food (i.e. chocolate (I'm going to hear about that)) or a certain food group (i.e. red meat or alcohol), it may be giving up some activity (i.e. Facebook, Twitter, or other social media, or TV), and adding more frequent attendance at the services of the church, such as our Wednesday evening services.

Though certainly not required, Christians who fast during Lent do so for the same reason congregations "fast" from using the word "Alleluia" and singing the "Gloria in Excelsis" during Lent – it is a means toward appreciating the good gifts of God more fully when we together celebrate the festival of the resurrection of His Son, Jesus Christ, at Easter. The words of our Lord from St. Mark above teach us something very important about such fasting. Focusing upon the fast itself misses the point – the fast is a preparation for something better to come – in other words, Christians fast in preparation for the feast!

God be with us and bless us as we together prepare for our Lord's Passion this Lent and always. To Christ alone be all the glory, forever and ever, amen.
