Dearly Beloved of Christ,

As one year ends and another begins, it's a good opportunity to both review what happened in the year now past, and anticipate what the new year will hold for us. By God's grace we will have perfect vision to do just that in the new year.

As we look back, with 2020 vision (②), we can't help but think how difficult a year it was. Certainly we remember and mourn the death of loved ones as we miss them and the blessing they were (and still are) to us. Of course, we're still dealing with COVID (and will for some time to come) – the fear of getting it or passing it on, the quarantines and lock-downs, the isolation and loneliness, the bother of face-masks and hand sanitizer, the devastation of shutdowns, not the least of which was not being able to gather as God's people in His house for a time. Many have struggled with health matters or financial problems of various kinds. And, since we are sinners dealing with sinners, there have been troubled relationships to deal with as well. There seems to be no end to the troubles.

But 2020 was not all negative. There were also great joys. Babies were born and baptized. After a short hiatus, we learned to record our services on Facebook Live, then transitioned back to in-person worship. The Sunday school resumed teaching Bible stories and telling children of Jesus. The adult Bible class resumed as well. And whether you consider it a plus or a minus, I was installed as your pastor shortly before the pandemic hit. God still provides abundant mercy toward us by bringing us through difficulties and joyful times, and most especially by the forgiveness of sins He so generously bestows in His Word and Sacraments.

As we look forward to the next year, we often think of new beginnings and changes we want to make in our lives. Some of these changes involve setting specific goals such as losing so many pounds, ridding ourselves of a bad habit, learning a new skill, or completing a certain project. Others involve changing our attitude and behavior (which may relate to certain goals) such as having daily devotions (by ourselves and/or with the family), exercising regularly, eating a better diet, watching less TV, and reading more, etc.

As a congregation, we also look forward to what God will do for us in the new year. We look forward to more reasons for rejoicing as our loving Father continues to bless us so richly (as individuals and as a congregation). And as we look forward, we have an opportunity to "start over" in a sense. No, we can't un-do the past, but we can live in the forgiveness God gives as we look to the future. We can re-dedicate ourselves each day to do whatever we can, in word and

deed, to help Immanuel/Augsburg thrive and grow, always depending on the Lord of the Church to bless us. And this means trusting our Lord in ALL things, including our daily needs.

So, as we enter the new year, I encourage you to make worship at Immanuel a very high priority. It's important that you are here each week to receive God's gifts of forgiveness, life, and salvation, for without His gifts our faith will not sustain us to the end. Furthermore, your attendance encourages others as well. (Note - if you are still concerned about the virus and don't feel safe coming to church, please contact me and I will be glad to visit you and bring you God's gifts.) Secondly, I urge you to have a regular devotional life individually and as a family. And parents, it's vital that you teach your children God's Word and the catechism at home, and bring them to God's House. Discuss spiritual and Biblical topics in the car and at home. And finally, pray for each other, your pastor, and your congregation, that the Lord would grant us grace and mercy to live as His dear children.

So as we enter the new year, keep these thoughts in front of you:

- Whatever you do, do all to the glory of God. (1 Corinthians 10:31)
- Watch, stand fast in the faith, be brave, be strong. Let all that you do be done with love. (1 Corinthians 16:13-14)
- Let us not grow weary while doing good, for in due season we shall reap if we do not lose heart. Therefore, as we have opportunity, let us do good to all, especially to those who are of the household of faith. (Galatians 6:9-10)
- And whatever you do in word or deed, do all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through Him. (Colossians 3:17)
