Dearly Beloved of Christ,

June, 2022

With June comes the summer. Things generally slow down a bit. There are vacations and trips and outings to enjoy. But don't let any of that keep you away from what's most important: receiving God's gifts in Word and Sacrament. After all, nothing, I repeat, nothing is more important than your coming to God's House each week to receive His gifts. God even gave us a commandment about it:

Remember the Sabbath day by keeping it holy.

What does this mean?

We should fear and love God so that we do not despise preaching and His Word, but hold it sacred and gladly hear and learn it.

But going/coming to Church each week is not merely an obligation, something we do because we have to or something we have to do to make God happy with us. No, it is so much more! It is the opportunity to gather with your church family, the Body of Christ, in God's presence and receive His gifts. It is what God's children do as they treasure His Word. It is the opportunity to give and receive encouragement for our daily life – by God's Word and the presence of our fellow Christians.

So don't absent yourself from God and His House. Instead, make it a priority to be in church each week with your family and fellow saints. Together, we build each other up in our holy faith and encourage each other toward repentance and faith, that we may rejoice with each other for eternity. Thus, the author to the Hebrews writes:

Let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, ²⁵ not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near. (Heb. 10:24-25)

This year in June, we celebrate Pentecost (June 5) and the Holy Trinity (June 12), and we remember fathers on June 19).

On Pentecost, we celebrate the outpouring of the Holy Spirit. That event is recorded in Acts 2. By the gift of the Holy Spirit, the apostles speak the Gospel of Christ to all those gathered in Jerusalem from the ends of the earth. Those people heard the Gospel in their own language, no matter where they were from. And having heard of Jesus, many repented of their sin and believed in Jesus for the forgiveness of sins and eternal life.

In the same way, the Holy Spirit still works through the Gospel to bring, and keep, people in the one, true faith. He "calls, gathers, enlightens, and sanctifies the whole Christian Church on earth and keeps it with Jesus Christ in the one true faith." That's why we celebrate Pentecost – for we have received the Holy Spirit and the faith He works through the Gospel. God grant that we would treasure that above all things.

The next week, on June 12, we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Trinity. It's a wonderful opportunity to hear once again how the entire Trinity, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, is at work in and for our salvation. You don't want to miss it! And we'll have something special for you.

To help you prepare for worship, here are the readings for those two Festivals:

 Pentecost (June 5)
 Holy Trinity (June 12)

 Genesis 11:1-9
 Proverbs 8:1-4, 22-31

 Acts 2:1-21
 Acts 2:14a, 22-36

 John 14:23-31
 John 8:48-59

Then, June 19 is Fathers' Day. Now, it's not a churchly holiday or observance, so we don't have special readings for that day. Still, it is good to remember fathers, especially since the devil and the world have so denigrated and despised fathers. So, make a special effort to attend service that day with your father, if you can. As much as your mother likes to have you in church on Mothers' Day, so your father would like to be with you on Fathers' Day. Come, one and all, to your Father's House to celebrate being His children and having Him as your Father.
